Drugs and Narcotics in Uganda

The World Drug Report 2011 estimates that in 2009, between 149 and 272 million people, or 3.3% to 6.1% of the population aged 15-64 used



Teenagers & youth; the main target

illicit substances at least once in the previous year. About half that number is estimated to have been current drug users, that is, having used illicit drugs in the past month. One of the most severe

consequences of drug use is the spread of HIV and other blood borne disease such as Hepatitis B and C. Drug use, especially injecting drug use (IDU) is closely linked to HIV transmission through the sharing needles, but also in relationship to the risky behaviors of non-injecting drug users.

Alcohol consumption has had devastating effects on the social fabric of society and the burden is incomprehensible – the country has witnessed over 300 people die and over 40 people blinded in the last 2 years due to drinking adulterated alcohol

with methanol .

One area of concern is the unacceptably high incidence narcotics drug trafficking and abuse in the country. Even the alarming statistic of 79% increase in narcotic trafficking and consumption does not, adequately, capture the



grave danger our society faces, from the abuse of recreational drugs like marijuana, and or hard drugs like cocaine and heroin, according to Kayihura the Inspector General of Police.

My name is Newton Mutisya. I am a born again and Christ is my personal Lord and Savior. I joined Teen Challenge Uganda last year in the month of June 2011 and I finished my Program this year in the month of June 2012.

Before I joined Teen Challenge, I was deep into alcoholism, smoking of bhang, cigarettes and chewing of khat. I started taking drugs back in the year 2006 and since then; they took control of me for 6 years. I became hopeless like a man without direction because I could not do without them. For 6 years, I was in chains of addiction. Drugs ruined my relationship with my parents and friends since nobody could trust me with anything. I could not even finish my

studies at the university because I could not do without drugs. I became a thief, a liar, a drunkard and a hypocrite just to get money. I suffered rejection and nobody wanted anything to do with me. I became an example of a waste life. These were the most difficult, hardest and painful moments of my life. I had reached rock bottom and I needed help.

Hopefully, my parents knew about Teen Challenge and they suggested for me to give it a try and I agreed to that, but just before I came to Teen Challenge, I knew in my heart how seriously I needed God's help for me to overcome my condition. So I decided to give my life to Jesus Christ a few days I came to Teen Challenge. Ever since I joined Teen Challenge, my life has completely changed. Teen Challenge taught me various things, i.e.
